**MOTION TO TENDER PHOTOGRAPH OR PHOTOGRAPHS DURING
VOIR DIRE**

The defendant, George Huguely ("Mr. Huguely"), by counsel, for his Motion to Tender Photograph or Photographs during Voir Dire, states the following:

1. The purpose of voir dire is to ensure that any juror who sits in judgment in this case is "indifferent to the cause" and can arrive at a decision based upon the evidence.
2. During the trial, photographs will be offered into evidence to which jurors may have strong reactions.
3. To ensure all evidence can be considered without bias, Mr. Huguely seeks leave to publish during voir dire a photograph or photographs designated in advance.

WHEREFORE the defendant, George Huguely, respectfully moves the Court to grant a *motion in limine* to allow publication of a photograph or photographs during voir dire, and to grant him all other relief the Court deems proper and appropriate.

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
